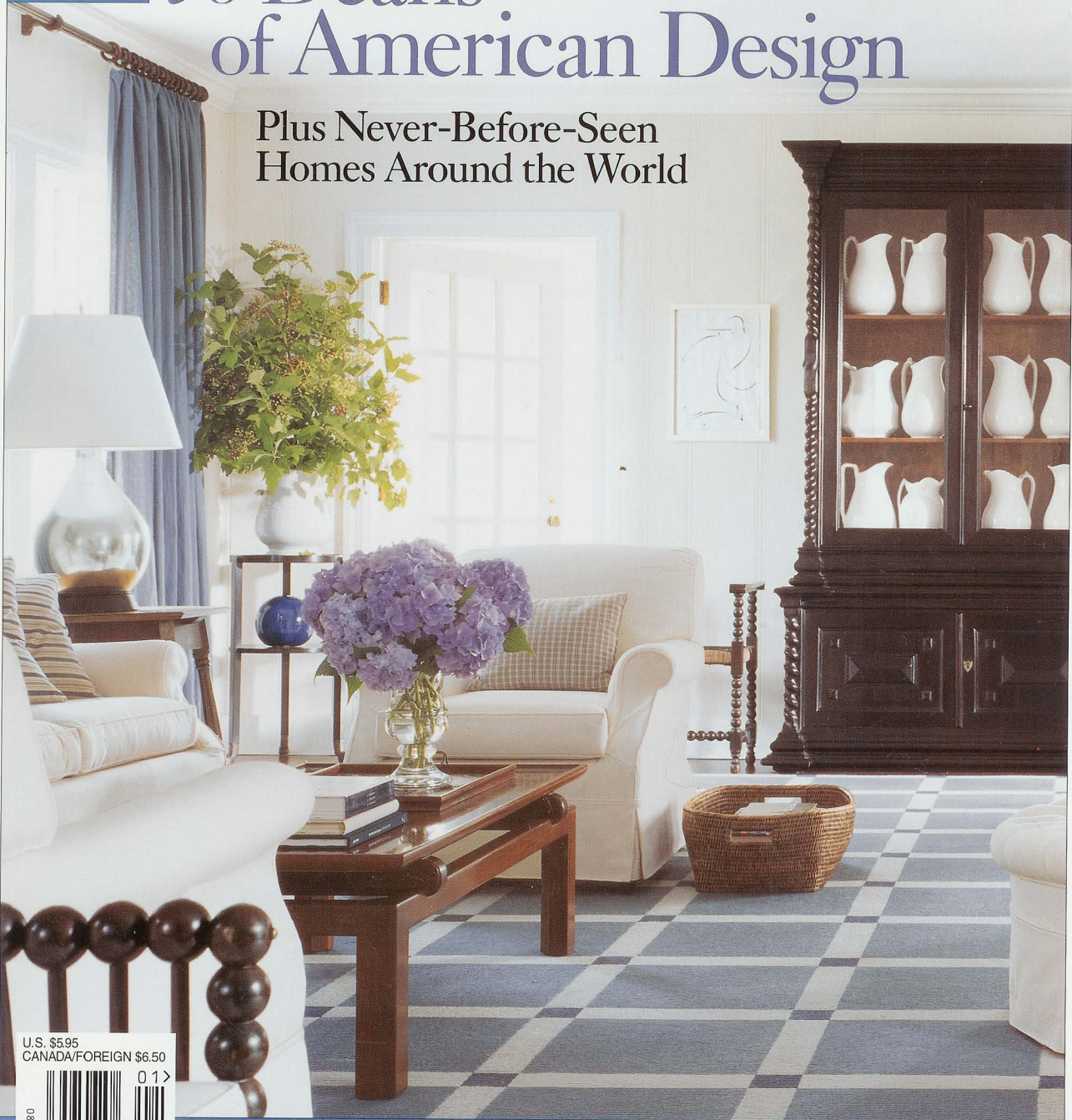

Modernism at Magen

Former dancer Huges Magen's appreciation for the arts has a new venue. He recently opened a shop in Manhattan that Robert Bray describes as "a modernism museum, where the inventory of pieces from the best midcentury designers is always changing."

Most of the furniture is French and important, including a 1954 *bibliothèque* by Charlotte Perriand, a 1950s Visiteur armchair and a 1952 table, both by Jean Prouvé (top), and a 1939 sofa and 1950s table by Jean Royère (above right). "I'm also researching and finding unusual works

from little-known but great mid-century ceramic designers. The response to these new beauties has been very positive," says Magen.
